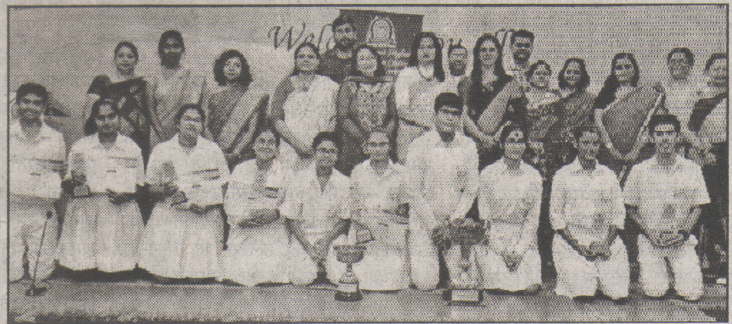

English debate competition held

KANPUR: Sir Padampat Singhania Education Centre organised an English debate competition in the memory of late Gopal Krishna Singhania, noted industrialist and entrepreneur on Tuesday in which 17 schools participated. Each student was given 4 minutes to express his opinion. The topic for the debate was 'Artificial Intelligence will supersede Human Intuitive Thinking.' The chief guest on the occasion was Shefali Raj, Deputy Director, PSIT. She said that after coming to this school she was reminded of her childhood days at Loreto, Convent. She said that it was a treat for her to be in school. She said that she was happy with the way the students rehearsed and presented themselves. She said that it takes a lot of courage to speak on stage. She said that students should never forget the hard-work of the teachers who prepared them for the debate. Shifting to her school days, she said, every activity happens for a reason in school, she said that needle work was taught in her school to instill patience in the students. She said that the certificates that student will be receiving in this debate competition will be very helpful in future. DrSuman Singh from PPN College was the judge of the debate. She said that the purpose of the debate was to make the communication skills of the students strong. She said that there is a need for creative thinking with original ideas in the debate. She said that there is a need to inculcate original thinking. She said that in olden times, debates were more aggressive but now the times have been changed. She said that no matter how much sophisticated AI develops, it will not be able to conquer human brain. She said that unlike humans, where law of genetics is followed and the character traits, intelligence is passed on from one generation

to another, it does not happen in machines. She said that human wisdom and human capabilities will outshine artificial intelligence.

Laxmi Pandey from DAV College was the second judge and Santoshi Mishra, Faculty, Speak Well was the third judge. She said that the performance was enthralling and said that the topic is very much relevant to human civilisation. She said that the content on which the students spoke was outstanding. She said that there was a natural flow of words while the students spoke.

Nidhi Mehrotra, Observer, HoD, Chintels School said that debate is a euphemism for argument. She said we are teaching our generation to be soft. She said that according to a research carried out at MIT in 2017, Scientists concluded when human cognitive thinking is put on Artificial Intelligence (AI), then it will become a passe. She said that we have even lived in an environment which was without algorithm and every thing went fine. She said we are multi-taskers, superseding won't happen in real world.

Arun Pathak, MLC was present as a guest of honour. He congratulated the participants

of the debate and talked about the evolution of AI and how it started in video games and chess games. He said that Amazon opened a store and employed 1200 people and soon after the use of machines in the store, 1200 people lost their jobs. He said that there are several disadvantages of AI apart from advantages. He said that we are so much dependent on AI that we do not use our intelligence. He said that we should not be dependent on AI.

One participant spoke that AI will be able to overcome the limitations of human mind and is here to stay for a long period of time. Deepansh from PuranChandra Vidya Niketan said AI has been created by human beings and will not be able to overpower humans. He said that many jobs requires miscellaneous skills, AI will fail to compete humans. He said that AI fails to express its credibility.

Another participant who spoke on the favour of the topic said that it is crystal clear that AI has already superseded human intuitive thinking. She said that intuition is illogical and irrational. She said that AI is much more important than intuition. She gave an example to prove her point that when

one is lost in a way, one does not rely on intuition but on Google Maps..

Ananya Trivedi from Virendra Swarup said that intuition is more important than AI. She said that the voice inside you that guided you through rough times is the intuition and how can one rely on silicon chips and wires. She said that AI can quickly process data but not abstract thinking. She said that AI works under human supervision. She said that one cannot teach AI about human bonding and love. She said that AI lacks emotions which humans have. She said that a wire circuit cannot replace humans.

Another participant opined that AI can end mankind, the future is in the hands of AI. He said that amplification of human intelligence with AI will lead to flourishing of technology.

The winners of the debate was Depanshi from Sanatam Dharam School, Shikha Shukla from Mariampur School, Saksham Pathak from DPS Azad Nagar. The runner-up trophy was given to Dr Virendra Swarup School, Awadhpuri and Winners trophy was bagged by Sanatam Dharma Education Centre.
