1. Activity Report:

Date : 02 October 2019

Event : Bhavanjali Venue : GHS-IMR

Details A heart-warming tribute to the three great Indians – Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation, Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri, the second Prime Minister of India and the Founder Chairman of the school, Revered Shri Govind Hari Singhania in an emotional event – *Bhavanjali*, was organized at GHS-IMR, Kamla Nagar, Kanpur on October 2, 2019. The ceremonial lighting of the lamp followed by an impassioned speech on our founder Chairman Shri Govind Hari Ji Singhania overwhelmed all. Event : START 6

Venue : Foundation Block [Dance Room]

Details : Our school organized a 5-Day Art Workshop 'START 6 (Stop Thinking Art is Really Tough Sixth Edition) in the foundation block for the students of Classes VI-XII from 15th October to 19th October, 2019. The Workshop commenced with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp. Thereafter, Suhani Kapoor, a student of Class IX welcomed the Resource person, Mr. Samir Sarkar and the participants. Mr. Samir Sarkar is a renowned artist from Kolkata, who has a Diploma in Visual Arts (Painting) from The Academy of Fine Arts, Kolkata. He was acknowledged as the 'Artist of the year 2013' by Colourentice and Tata Steel and 2000 Honorable Guest from India, Salon, rational Des Artistes, France. The gifted artist held his first solo show in his college in the year 1997. His work soon became popular and he held many more solo and group shows in Hyderabad, Delhi, Bangalore, Mumbai, Odisha, Kolkata, Pondicherry, Chandigarh, Austin, Dubai, U.S.A, Singapore, Berlin and France. His technique and usage of acrylic paints give his paintings an authentic sense of reality. His canvases are mostly occupied by human figures wearing a headgear and has a face

painted on them which depict the double-faced nature of people and this gives his paintings an authentic sense of reality. His paintings show that if hard work and passion hold hands, any goal can be achieved.

On the first day of the workshop the famed artist interacted with each student and encouraged them to draw free hand sketches using charcoal, a tool that's very popular with artists who like to do fast sketching. The artist told the students that art is a poetry written with colors, that reflects an artist's perspective of the world, of the things and of the people around him. He asked the students not to have defined goals for paintings and allowed the amateur artists to work freely using their own imagination. The young artists immersed themselves into their work and came out with varied and diverse sketches based on the themes like environment, social evils, human follies, status of women in the society etc. The students had a great time exploring the texture and tonal quality of charcoal and learnt that it is great for adding fine details or lighter value to casual sketches.

The second day of START 6 was thrilling for the budding artist as they learnt to paint with music and dance. They observed various 'Hast Mudras' of Kathak performed by Vanshika Singh of Class 11 and then went on to paint the same with acrylic colors. Dance and music helped the children to understand and appreciate art better. They showcased immense talent as they drew the composite and non-composite hand gestures of Kathak dance. The idea behind this was to make one artist understand the other and use one art form to express another. The mélange of the Performing and Fine Arts created an ambience that left a smile on everyone's face.

The third, fourth and the last day of the workshop was the day of Art Installation fondly christened by the students as 'The Nave!'. This day saw quite an innovation as the budding artists of the school collected the furniture lying waste in the school premises, renovated it, gave it a shape with their imagination and installed it for the art exhibition on the fourth day. Through this type of art installation Mr. Sarkar made an effort to channelize the dormant talents of the students as they learnt to repurpose the existing materials and transform them into thought-provoking art work. Around 40 students of the school attended the workshop under the guidance of the Art Teachers of the school. The workshop closed with a motivating speech by Mr. Samir Sarkar who told the students that art is something which reflects an artist's perspective of the world, of the things and of the people around him. He asked the students to use visually relaxing and earthy color tones to bring out the essence of peace and calmness. The participants of the workshop were also conferred with a cash prize along with a Certificate of Appreciation.

These awards have been instituted by the school for the first time this year to encourage the young artists. A catalogue of the children's artwork was also inaugurated during the exhibition. The school has been conducting such artist-led START workshops from last 6 years to promote art and encourage students to engage with art, culture and ideas and voice their thoughts and opinions in unique and diverse ways. The Vice Chairperson of the school, Ms. Varsha Singhania who is herself a connoisseur of art, praised the novel and prolific work of the students and opined that art improves critical thinking, concentration, perception and integration skills.
