Details : A webinar series was organized by the CBSE from 5th October, 2021 to 8th October, 2021 for the teachers teaching Science, Mathematics, Social Science and English to Grades IX-XII. In order to disseminate knowledge about preparing good questions. The webinar of first day basically focused on Competency based Education of Science which consists of:

- a) Demonstration of learning outcomes
- b) Progression based on attaining proficiency
- c) Self-paced, individualized learning

It emphasized on constructive alignment which consists of learning outcomes, activities and Teaching and learning outcomes. The webinar also dealt with Aligning reforms in curriculum, pedagogy and assessments which consisted of the following areas:

- Adoption of learning outcomes in 2019 (NCERT)
- Diverse formats of questions introduced (2019)
- Inclusion of competency-based questions from 2019-20 onwards
- Capacity building of teachers
- Creation of resources

It elaborated on the validity and reliability of the question paper. Validity ensures that the question paper should measure the attainment of learning outcomes. Reliability refers to the fact that the question paper should measure the attainment of learning outcomes consistently and accurately. The webinar laid emphasis on ensuring quality assessment which includes the following points:

- Adherence to the learning outcomes/assessment framework
- Balanced blueprint
- Good quality items
- Good quality scoring guides

General guidelines for Board examinations 21-22 were discussed:

- Academic session is divided into two terms with approximately 50% syllabus in term 1 and in term 2 each.
- Term 1 will have a 90 minutes MCQ paper whereas Term 2 will have 120 minutes paper with Questions of different formats.
- The question paper should have 20 - 25 Percent additional questions in each section to allow them to exercise their choices.
- 20 percent case-based study Questions should be there in the question paper.

Technical quality of a test or exam should focus on:

- Cognitive complexity
- Content quality
- Meaningfulness
- Language appropriateness
- Transfer and generalizability
- Fairness
- Reliability

The importance of open-ended Questions in Objective paper was discussed. A sample blueprint for science class X was shared along with several conceptual questions.

Details : The webinar began with an opening note by Shri Al Hilal Ahmed followed by Mr. Rahul Sofat who said that the aim of the webinar was to learn how to make good assessment which is valid reliable and at the same time, fair.

Agenda: Focus Area

- Qualities of good questions
- Best practices in creating good MCQ' s
- Making case-based questions

Advantages of MCQ's

- Scoring is efficient, objective and data formats are easy to analyze at large scale
- Can be used to diagnose misconceptions / common errors.
- Can be used to test skills of all cognitive levels.

Disadvantages /Challenges of MCQ's

- Challenging to make higher-level questions.
- Cannot reveal what students are thinking as student work showing his reasoning is not visible.
- Time consuming to construct a good question with good distractors.

A good question should

- Test a skill or concept that is worth understanding
- Be error free.
- Be age appropriate
- Really test what is intended to be tested.
- State what is expected in clear and unambiguous terms.
- Use clear, concise and age- appropriate language.
- Distinguish real learning from apparent learning.
- Help diagnose common errors/misconceptions whenever relevant.
- Be interesting and stimulate thinking.

A good question should not

- Check for trivial or inconsequential details.
- Be taken verbatim from textbooks as much as possible to distinguish between a true learner and a rote learner.

Qualities of good case based MCQ's

- Authentic / realistic context
- Informative and engaging.
- Relatable.
- Less text to comprehend.
- Unfamiliar (not taken from text – book)

Sourcing a case / situation for case-based questions

- Maps
- Time-Zones and International travel /itinerary
- Coordinate systems
- Board games and card games/magic
- Clinical trials.
- Simulations/thought experiments.
- Physical phenomenon (application of Math in Physics)
- Application of Math in sports.

Guidelines(recommendation) for MCQ's

- Concept / skill worth assessing.
- Age-appropriate language and easy to comprehend.
- Distractors -well defined, plausible and discerning.
- The context used in a question is apt and something students can relate to and engaging.
- Options are arranged in increasing or decreasing order of numbers or word length to avoid guessing.
- Calculations simple as possible.
- Restrict questions with negatives especially the ones of 'double negative' form.
- Avoid labelling of objects in figures as A, B, C and D.
- Restrict use of options as – none of the above.
- Variables should always be in italics.

Common Mistakes committed by question makers

- Stem not clear and sufficiently detailed. (i.e., variables used may not be well defined or units of measurement not written).
- Distractors are not plausible and discerning.
- Context or a real-life situation used is not authentic.

- Question does not assess the intended testing objective and not assessing the core understanding.
- Irrelevant difficulty added to an item contributing to cognitive load for a test taker.

Points related to overall assessment paper

- Ensure that the assessment has good balance of questions varying cognitive levels.
- Discriminates between the low ability students by having easy questions of varying difficulty.
- Discriminates between high ability students by having difficult questions of varying difficulty.
- Answer options are well distributed.
- Ensure the assessment is completed within the stipulated time.

The webinar was very informative, valuable and interesting and helped the teachers to better understand the new mode of assessment by CBSE.

Details : CBSE had organized a Webinar of Competency Based Question Development for teachers teaching Social Science in Classes IX & X. The points discussed are mentioned below:

Topics discussed –

- What makes a good question?
- Significance of case-based and source-based questions
- Significance of assertion-reason questions

Points discussed–

- Avoid negative phrasing
- Use only valid reading errors
- Highlight negative phrasing
- No multiple negatives
- Don't repeat words from the stem
- Should be parallel with the other options in all dimensions – length, grammar, idea.

Key elements of the paper –

- Sections
- Chapter weightage
- Question
- Case-based questions
- Bloom's taxonomy domains in questions
- Questions using figures/diagrams/pictures/web-charts/maps
- Questions for the visually impaired candidates.

What makes a good question?

- Test a skill or concept that is worth understanding
- Be interesting and stimulate thinking
- Be age appropriate
- Really test what is intended to be tested
- State what is expected in clear and unambiguous terms
- Use clear, concise, and age-appropriate language
- A good question should NOT be taken directly from the wording in textbook exercises
- Check for trivial or inconsequential details
- Use terms like 'best' and 'most' for higher order thinking questions
- Use simple language (active voice, simple tense) and vocabulary 1 grade lower
- Avoid testing trivial information
- No bias or stereotyping of any kind
- Give sufficient information
- Should have very clear instructions
- Test what is intended to test as a learning outcome
- Should have correct grammar, punctuation, capitalization, spellings
- Distractors as not to confuse kids but to point the wrong notions they might have
- Easy to read and interpret
- Lack of language ability
- Should not be a hindrance to answer the questions.

Significance of case-based and source-based questions

- Use of what and which
- Should be appropriate and consistent
- Do not use personal pronouns

Overall, the session was very informative, interesting, and worth attending.

Towards the end of the workshop, queries of the participants were answered. The webinar was highly informative, lively and enriching.
