INDEPENDENT ME

- > Buttoning and unbuttoning shirt
- >Put on your socks and shoes
- > Keeping belongings back in their places
- >Filling water bottles
- > Keeping room clean and well- organised
- >Eating on their own
- >Using a fork and spoon

- >Go outdoors and play with your friends




ENHANCE ORATORY SKILLS

Communication skills play a pivotal role in grooming the overall personality of a child. Let's motivate them to converse in English and to help him/her get acquainted with the language. Use more English words to increase his/her vocabulary. Motivate them to answer your questions in simple but full sentences. Let's encourage the kids to use magic words (sorry, thank you, excuse me, please) in different situations on regular basis. Remember, the more you use these words, your children are likely to use them too.

Use these sentences regularly:

- How are you? I'm good. Thank you.
- I am thirsty. Please give me water.
- Please, open/close my tiffin / bottle.
- I am hungry. Please give me food.
- I have finished my work/food.
- May I wash my hands?



Reading story books enhances language and vocabulary development. Introduce your child to picture books, story books and converse with them to develop their vocabulary and communication skills by encouraging them to talk about the pictures they see in the story books. Make bedtime reading a regular practice with your child. Suggested story book series- Bubbles. Pepper, Bruno, Ladybird (Level 1).



Hands-on Learning

Watch Me Try!

Wash a handkerchief
and learn the
opposites-wet/dry,
Dirty/clean.

Shape Sorting

Find and name different shapes around the house.
Tear old magazine papers into small pieces.
Paste within a circle.

Nature Walk

Water the plants in the garden with an adult. Identify red and yellow flowers.

Handprint Animals

Using paints, have your child make fingerprints on paper. Transform these prints into animals by adding features like ears, tails, and eyes with markers or crayons.

Threading Beads

Practice fine motor skills by making bead necklaces.

Puzzle Time

Learn to fix a simple 4-piece puzzle.

Obstacle Course

Set up a small course with pillows and chairs to crawl under or jump over.

Daily Chores

Help mummy make a fruit salad. Name the fruits and identify their taste.

Garden Yoga

Introduce 3-5 simple yoga poses with animal names (cat, cobra, butterfly). Practice breathing and stretching with calming musice

My Favourite Song Performance

Pick their favourite Hindi or English nursery rhyme. Help them sing and perform it with hand actions.
