Learning Objectives

By the end of the holiday programme, the child will:

- Develop Language and Storytelling Skills
- Recognise and Express Basic Emotions
- Enhance Fine Motor and Creative Abilities
- Understand Simple Concepts of Nature and Environment
- Build Focus, Independence, and Observation Skills

Summer Habit Building

Children should be encouraged to:

- Wake up Early and Follow a Routine
- Stay Hydrated
- Listen to One Story Daily
- Engage in Free Play
- Spend Time Outdoors
- Reduce Screen Exposure



Fun Activities

1. Mystery Bag Game

Materials: 1 small bag + 2–3 objects

How to do:

- Put 2–3 simple items inside (spoon, toy, leaf)
- Touch and explore.
- Then create a story using those items

Why kids love it: Surprise and Guessing Creates Excitement

2. One-Sound Music Band

Materials: One utensil (spoon/bowl)

How to do:

- Create different sounds using one object:
 - tap slow
 - tap fast
 - loud/soft
- Parent sings and the child creates rhythm

Learning: Develops Listening, Rhythm, and Coordination Skills

3. Hand Shadow Fun

Materials: Torch/light & wall

How to do:

- Show simple shadows:
 - Bird
 - Dog
- Let child create their own

Learning- Imagination, Hand Coordination and Visual Recognition

4. Edible Art (2 Ingredients Only)

How to do:

- Bread and Jam Fun - Create cheerful smiley faces using jam spreads.
- Chocolate and Banana Delight - Decorate banana slices with chocolate to make creative treats.

Learning- Creativity, Sensory Exploration, and Fine Motor Skills

Fun Activities

5. ONCE UPON A VERY OLD TIME

How to do:

- Parent selects any 2 household objects
- Initiates a simple story
- Child participates using actions/sounds
- Repeat with different objects on alternate days

Learning: Enhances Vocabulary, Sequencing, and Creative Thinking

6. BIG FEELINGS, LITTLE ME

How to do:

- Draw one face outline on an art sheet.
- Change expressions daily (happy, sad, angry, sleepy).

Learning- Emotional Recognition and Expression.

7. Finger Dot Painting

Materials : Any One Paint Colour

How to do:

- Use only fingers
- Make dots to create:
 - Flowers
 - Rain
 - Stars

Learning - Artistic Expression and Observation Skills.

8. Sorting Basket Game

Materials: 5–6 mixed items, Sorting Baskets

How to do:

- Pick, observe, and sort items by colour, size, or type into the correct basket.

Learning: Develops Observation, Sorting Skills, and Logical Thinking.

Fun Activities

9. Mirror Talk Time

How to do:

- Stand in front of mirror
- Say - I am happy, I am strong & brave
- Make funny faces

Learning - Builds Confidence, Speaking Skills and Self- Expression.

10. Ice Melt Fun

Materials: Ice Cubes

How to do:

- Let the child hold and explore the Ice cube, watch it slowly melt, and talk about how it feels.

Learning - Builds Sensory Awareness, Observation and Science Skills

11. Touch & Feel Fun

Materials : Rice, Flour, Sand Tray, Small Toys/Objects

How to do:

- Fill a tray with rice, flour or sand.
- Hide small toys or objects inside.
- Ask the child to find them using only their hands.
- Let them draw lines and shapes with their fingers.

Learning - Develops Sensory Exploration, Creativity, and Eye Hand Coordination

12. Little Discoverers

How to do:

- Take your child for a short nature walk.
- Collect leaves, flowers, and small twigs.
- Compare big and small leaves.
- Do leaf rubbings using paper and crayon.

Learning - Develops Nature Awareness, Comparison Skills and Sensory Exploration



All activities should be done with joy and encouragement, not pressure.
The goal is to make children happy learners through play.
